Fostering Church Vitality A note from the pastor – as the program year ends – looking to the future

Since beginning my ministry here I have been observing how UCC Greenawalds does church. I have noticed that there is much to celebrate. I see a genuinely friendly and welcoming faith community committed to supporting one another in prayer and making a difference in the world by work and mission giving in the community and the world. I have also noted questions that are being posed that imagine what the church might become in the near and distant future.

The Questions

What is our mission? Why do we exist? What is God calling us to be and do? What can we foresee on the horizon and how can we be flexible in a time of so much change? Might we look at our bylaws, perhaps revise structures of boards and committees? What are the best use of our resources for mission, outreach, and meeting budgetary obligations? How do we create lively and joyful worship that is authentic in various seasons of faith? How do we support people who are tired, who have continued past the usual term of office? How do we invite other folks to step up and prepare them for leadership?

The Opportunity – Vitality Days for the PNEC with Michael Piazza of Agile Church

Early this year I was invited to become a part of a new working group of the Penn Northeast Conference. The PNEC Congregational Vitality Team was convened to address questions such as those listed above. Ours is not the only church facing these issues, and there are resources available to us. Over the past several decades churches have experienced dramatic changes in membership and patterns of attendance. But the era of the church as central gathering place for most or all community activities is long past. As a result churches are looking to redefine their place and role in society while living into the call of following Jesus individually and in community.

Michael Piazza spoke to those in attendance at the PNEC annual meeting. He is energetic, dynamic, and has led churches he served in the work of revitalization. Daylong workshops he leads will explore needs and offer tools for addressing them in the local church.

Session 1 - Transformational Worship - September 22, 2018

Session 2 - Structure and Stewardship - November 10, 2018

Session 3 - Craft Church Evangelism - March 23, 2019

Session 4 - Vintage Church Renewal - May 18, 2019

Participating congregations will send up to 10 representatives to each of the four daylong workshops. Participants may be the same for all workshops or may differ based on skills, congregational roles or experience, and interest. I would suggest a bit of both, some who attend all sessions and some who attend one or more based on their particular passion for church life and ministry.

Volunteers Needed – We Need You!!

We need representation from a broad spectrum of church members! Is there a particular ministry of the church you would like to explore and support? Please speak to a member of the Ministry Council or to me.

Details

In the near future members of the congregation will be asked to help in completing a brief congregational assessment tool. And yes, there is a cost to the congregation, but considering the value it is nominal. A total of \$1,000 will be paid by the church, half of it covered by the pastor's continuing education funds, as I see the workshops as essential to my ministry with you. Additionally, there will be a small cost for the catered lunch each day.

Next week I will attend training as a coach for churches involved in similar work. Over the summer I will be reading a variety of books that address church vitality. I believe this is work essential for the survival and flourishing of this and other faith communities. I will be talking and learning with and from others who are leading their churches into this new era of Christian work and witness.

In times of change it is common for people to be fearful, to long for stability, to ask: What shall we do? What is next? Will we survive? The prophet Isaiah had words for just such a time:

"Do not fear, for I have redeemed you;
I have summoned you by name; you are mine.
When you pass through the waters,
I will be with you;
and when you pass through the rivers,
they will not sweep over you.
When you walk through the fire,
you will not be burned;
the flames will not set you ablaze.

"Forget the former things;
do not dwell on the past.
See, I am doing a new thing!
Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?
I am making a way in the wilderness
and streams in the wasteland.
The wild animals honor me,
the jackals and the owls,
because I provide water in the wilderness
and streams in the wasteland,
to give drink to my people, my chosen,
the people I formed for myself
that they may proclaim my praise.

Let us together see and discern what it is that God is doing among us.


