

DISCOVERY PROJECT UPDATE

Our April informal discussion with the South Whitehall Township Zoning officer resulted in a "not permitted in the zoning district" response concerning the plan for the annex to be used as a residence for Family Promise clients. This response, although disappointing, was not unexpected.

The team met with attorney, Matt Mobilio, and architect, Glenn Lichtenwalner, on May 4 to discuss the next steps.

An official application will be submitted to SWT zoning. This filing is a formality, as it will most likely be denied. At that point, we will file for an appeal to get an "exception for use" variance for the annex. A hearing before the zoning board will be planned.

This all sounds a bit overwhelming and maybe confusing. I know it is for many of us who have listened to the professionals discuss this project.

Trusting the process can be difficult and frustrating, but in the meantime, we will continue to reorganize and purge areas of the building that could use a little refresh.

Nanci Snyder has been working with her crew in the library. Books that are no longer up to date or deemed unnecessary will be offered for free in the Narthex (look for the table with the red cloth). We will also be offering Bibles for free to the community at our outdoor events this summer.

From the Music Director... It's ANT'S CORNER

Hey! I thought that for this month's "Ant's Corner", I'd deviate a bit from church activities and tell you a bit about my musical history, and how it plays such a big role in the way I play for you each week.

You may notice that I often don't look at the music in front of me, with the exception of some of the hymns that are not particularly familiar to me. This is because I've learned to

play many pieces of music "by ear".

But, what does this mean, exactly?

Consider the way that you use your own singing voice. There are many songs that you sing "by ear"; so, you already understand the concept. You don't need to see the musical notation when you are singing things like "Amazing Grace" or "How Great Thou Art". This is because the melodic intervals are familiar to you. Yes, the "intervals", not so much the pitches themselves. The component that allows you to sing, and re-sing, songs that you've heard many times in your life is actually based on the spaces that you hear between the notes. I am not referring to spaces in the timing or length between the pitches; I am talking about the "space" between the actual pitches.

If you were to sing a major scale (do-re-mi-fa... etc.), the reason you can do this is you've learned what the intervals are between these pitches. When referring to "intervals" in musical language, it does not refer to the way we typically use the word (i.e. "do this routine in two-minute intervals"), it is referring to a fairly abstract identification of the distance between two notes. The intervals in a major scale are WHOLE STEP, WHOLE STEP, WHOLE STEP, WHOLE STEP, WHOLE STEP, WHOLE STEP, WHOLE STEP and HALF STEP. If you go over to your piano (assuming you have one readily available... hah), and you were to plunk out a random pitch, then SKIP a key to the next pitch, that represents a WHOLE STEP. Then do another WHOLE STEP (remember, skip a key), then a HALF STEP (don't skip a key), then continue this process using the formula above, you will suddenly find yourself playing a major scale on the piano. (Whether you realize it or not, you have already mastered this technique using your own voice.)

Almost all songs written in Western Culture utilize a combination of these very notes. That's why it is relatively easy for you to remember how to sing by ear. We've been hearing this formula from the time we were infants from nursery rhymes, hymns, Christmas songs... you name it.

Now, just imagine taking this skill that you already possess, and applying to a physical instrument, such as a piano or guitar. If you learn how to play the major scale, you can, in theory, plunk out the melody to any song... just in the same way you can hum melodies.

I had the great fortune of having a dad that encouraged my ability to play by ear. Often, this very natural skill is stifled by traditional methods of learning, in which you are taught to read everything that you play. If you don't use the skill of playing by ear, then it is never actually developed. It would be like having to carry around a dictionary everywhere you go in order to communicate effectively with people.

Having said this, the written form of language is essential (remember, music is a language). It is the means by which we share our ideas with others. But, if you only rely on the written form, you never truly internalize what you're doing. Okay... my last analogy: if, when you were taught to drive a car, you were required to consult a map for local trips to church or the grocery store, you may never really learn the lay of the land, as you would have become dependent on the map.

Go ahead and give it a try. Plunk out a major scale! Here's a little cheat for you. Instead of observing the whole, whole, half formula, just play the white keys on your piano. The white keys are already laid out in this formula for the key of "C". Now, after plunking your way up the scale, starting on a C and ending on a C, try and find hidden melodies within this scale. It's a little like finding Waldo! Try playing the scale backward... from a high C down to a low C. Can you hear the melody for "Joy to the World"?

Thank you, that will be fifty dollars!
