
FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR & Music Director



DISCOVERY PROJECT UPDATE

In June we reported that our Zoning application was denied. Although disappointing, it was not unexpected.

The application for appeal has been filed with South Whitehall Township Zoning Board. We anticipate being on the August 23 7PM Zoning Hearing Board agenda.

South Whitehall Township will be notifying neighbors within 300 feet of our building of our request for use variance as well as the date and time of hearing.

The Discovery Project Team, along with Family Promise representatives, will be holding two town hall meetings to discuss our partnership and mission to prevent and alleviate housing insecurity in our area.

The town hall meetings will be held Sunday, August 13 at 4 PM and Thursday, August 17 at 7 PM. Neighbors will be notified by fliers delivered the first week of August, inviting them to attend one of the two offered meetings.

Members of UCCG are also invited to attend these meetings in support of this project.

We would also like to encourage members of UCCG living in the Greenawalds area to have informal conversations with their neighbors encouraging them to attend the information sessions.

Although the township zoning board will be looking at zoning codes, having neighborhood support for this project is very important.

Family Promise issues a quarterly newsletter - this is an excerpt from 3rd quarter 2023 - Volunteer/Donor Spotlight. The Family Promise organization is grateful for everything Sue Roth does for them and the families in the program.

VOLUNTEER/DONOR SPOTLIGHT

When the Parkland School District first joined with the National Family Promise office to organize support for a growing number of children experiencing homelessness in their schools, Sue Roth and her church, UCC Greenawalds, answered the call to get involved. With the help of several area congregations, Family Promise of Lehigh Valley was born in 2018. In fact, UCC Greenawalds was the first church to sign on as a host congregation, and Sue quickly signed up to be the host coordinator. In this role she and her team organize meals, overnight stays, set up and break down the family living quarters, shop for food to provide breakfast and snacks and ensure there is always volunteers to offer friendship and support to area families in need.

Today, Sue, in addition to her regular host coordinator responsibilities, works with the Family Promise Staff to continue to recruit and train new host and support congregation, allowing us to serve more families in need. You can always count on Sue whenever we need something that will help the children. She loves spending time with the families and children when her church is hosting. In her spare time, she comes to the FP Day Center to do arts and crafts and singalongs with the children when they have down time during summer school break. She is an enthusiastic volunteer for our Sip and Mingle, Annual Homecoming and our Purse Bingo committees. Sue learned early on from her aunt and grandmother that "when someone is in need you just help". She believes that everyone needs and deserves compassion, love and understanding.

After a coworker's home burned down and she lost everything, Sue realized homelessness can happen to anyone, at any time. "We need to be there for each other to get through the hard times". Sue is always there. *Thank you!!*
