Ant's Corner



Undoubtedly, the past couple of months have been nothing short of intriguing. It's a relief to be back in action, even if it means working from a hotel room. No complaints, though – the complimentary breakfast is a delightful perk!



Over the weekend, Pastor Janet and I had the pleasure of attending an event in Coatesville, PA, nestled in Chester County – yes, the same county where an inmate serving a life sentence for murder recently escaped! The event, "Jamboree in the Pines," was hosted by my friend Richard Troxell, an alumnus of

the esteemed Academy of Vocal Arts in Philadelphia, along with my musical compadre, Dan May.

As we drove along the picturesque country roads en route to the jamboree, I couldn't help but spot an Amish gentleman steering his horse and buggy. My initial thought was, "that seems inconvenient." Then it struck me – does he find it more cumbersome than dealing with monthly car payments, exorbitant gas prices, and sky-high insurance rates?

That evening, I decided to delve a little deeper into the Amish way of life. How did I do this? With technology, of course!

While I already grasped their avoidance of technology as a means to maintain simplicity, I yearned for a better understanding. This is what I learned:

Beyond the pursuit of simplicity, the Amish place significant emphasis on self-sufficiency and self-reliance. Their avoidance of modern conveniences fosters the development of essential skills, nurturing a stronger sense of community as they frequently rely on one another for daily needs.

Environmental stewardship holds great importance for the Amish, aligning seamlessly with their theological beliefs, which revolve around honoring God's creation.

The deliberate avoidance of technology serves as a means for the Amish to preserve their cultural identity and unique way of life. It sets them apart from the broader society, reinforcing their commitment to their values and traditions – it keeps them unmistakably "Amish."

The more I delved into their way of life, the clearer it became that the Amish aren't anti-technology; they are pro-community, pro-nature, pro-faith, and pro-simplicity. The absence of technology shields them from temptations that might erode these fundamental principles.

I'm aware that I'm often guilty of using my phone at the dinner table or when spending time with guests. While many of you may handle this better than I do, if you find yourself sharing this bad habit with me, consider taking a simple step: silence your phone and leave it in another room. Fully engage with the people right in front of you.

It's challenging to determine whether technology has genuinely improved our lives; it has undoubtedly changed them. It allows many of you to participate in our Sunday service, even when unwell or on vacation. As with all things in life, balance is key. Technology, when used for virtuous reasons, is a blessing.

In conclusion, I believe there are several lessons to be gleaned from the Amish way of life. It serves as a poignant reminder that in a world increasingly dominated by technology, there remains profound wisdom in embracing timeless values – faith, community, and above all, humility.

One thing I am certain of: the next time I pass an Amish horse and buggy, I won't ponder their inconvenience. Instead, I'll envy their profound sense of peace.

As UCCG moves to becoming a WISE (Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive and Engaged) Congregation for ALL, we are so excited to announce a new Mental Health Ministry team! Our team's mission is to break the silence and stigma surrounding mental illness and addiction, to educate ourselves, and to provide support to those in need.

The National Alliance on Mental Illness [NAMI] states that one out of five adults live with mental illness so it is likely we will all be affected by mental illness and addiction, if we are not already. And let's face it— with the start of a new school year and mounting stress, we can all benefit from learning more about mental health and wellness. So keep an eye out for mental health tips and tidbits to be highlighted each Sunday in September!


We also plan to start an all-congregational book study this fall featuring *Blessed Are The Crazy: Breaking the Silence about Mental Illness, Family, and Church* by Sarah Griffith Lund. In this memoir, which has become a resource for faith-based groups to provide healing and support to those impacted by mental illness, Lund reflects on her father's battle with Bipolar Disorder and other family members' mental health challenges.

If you got this far you may be saying. "WAIT, What?? An ALL-CONGREGATIONAL Book Study?? What is **THAT??**"

The goal of this kind of study is to get ALL OF YOU to read the SAME book over the next 2 months so that all of UCC Greenawalds is engaged at the same time to think about one subject or question. In this case, how do we break the silence about mental illness, family and church??

There will be sermons around various topics from the book in October and deeper conversations will occur during the Adult Class 9am on Sunday mornings which YOU ARE INVITED TO JOIN. 
