

Ant's Corner Inside Edition, part 3

"Recovery in Christ"



Time seems to be slipping by rather swiftly, with about three months now in my rearview mirror. Initially, upon my arrival, I was resolute in my decision not to fully immerse myself in my new surroundings – the culture, the people, everything – except for the captivating allure of the new keyboard in the chapel. I somehow convinced myself that maintaining a state of partial denial and detachment would serve me best. However, as someone once

wisely remarked, "If you're not where you are, you are nowhere."

It appears I disregarded some of the sentiments I expressed in an earlier Echoes article, particularly the notion of finding God's presence in the community surrounding us. Admittedly, amidst the individuals surrounding me lately, recognizing God's presence isn't always straightforward. Nevertheless, I'm improving at keeping my senses attuned to God. To echo a sentiment from Ecclesiastes 4:9-12, two are better than one but three is stronger still. We are all stronger when we walk together in community with one another and, especially, with God.

Though I am unable to refer back to one of my previous articles due to the lack of technology, I recall drawing parallels between the benefits of community in twelve-step groups and having involvement in a church such as Greenawalds. I pondered the potential synergy between the two. It seems I was attempting to reinvent the wheel.

Recently, I encountered a group called "Celebrate Recovery," a Christ-centered recovery program which I hadn't heard of before. This program is rooted in the Beatitudes and other scripture, intertwining each step of recovery with bible passages.

One thing that has helped me stay ok during this time away is being able to remain connected to my church and my family. As a member of UCCG's Mental Health Ministry Team, I would like to encourage you to join us for worship this Sunday, June 2 for Mental Health Awareness Sunday. Keystone UCC Conference Meeting Friday, June 7 – Sunday, June 9, 2024 The Penn Stater Hotel & Conference Center, State College, PA



For the first time, all 4 PA conferences of the UCC will be gathering for a shared Meeting on June 7-9, 2024. Jayne Christman and Pastor Janet will be attending virtually and representing UCC Greenawalds as voting delegates for Penn Northeast Conference. (Pastor Janet would normally be more involved but is double booked that weekend with a wedding in New Jersey!)

But Wait... What is this KEYSTONE CONFERENCE?? I thought we were in the Penn Northeast Conference?!

YES! We are currently in the PNEC. The other 3 conferences, along with PNEC, have been talking about merging into ONE conference to be better stewards of our resources. The *Keystone Working Group* has been meeting since October 2022 to explore this possible merger.

During this upcoming Keystone UCC Conference Meeting in June there will be shared worship, workshops, meals and meetings, as well as, each conference's separate business meetings. This intentional time together provides space for *Keystone Conference* conversations and learning. There will be fellowship, informational sessions devoted to discussion about what it would mean for all of us if we became the Keystone Conference, instead of the four separate conferences we are today.

When Do We Vote on Becoming the KEYSTONE UCC Conference??

Not until November. The vote on a merger will happen on <u>Saturday November 9 at 11:30 am.</u> The meeting for PNEC will begin at 9:00 am. We will also have our annual budget presentation and vote that morning. The November 9 Fall Meeting will be a hybrid meeting at St. John's UCC, Laurys Station. Voting at 11:30 will happen at the same time across all four conferences! We would only move forward with a Conference merger IF 67% of each voting body says yes.

Voting on November 9 will be done by clergy and by church delegates. Churches will entrust their delegates with their vote. If the merger passes, we will become a member of the new Conference!

If the vote passes in November, then an official Special Motion will be sent to General Synod to be voted upon at the Kansas City Synod in 2025. A Synod vote is required for a Conference to change its boundaries. WOW!!!

BETHLEHEM EMERGENCY SHELTERING

Bethlehem Emergency Sheltering (BES) is a faith-based partnership that provides a network of care and hospitality for the homeless in the Bethlehem community. Overnight sheltering is provided during the coldest months of the year - November to April. Meals are provided during overnight sheltering. However, volunteers from organizations, churches and the community create and provide bagged lunches served each weekend during the months when sheltering is not available.

CHOW CHOW


Please remember we sanitize and re-use the chow chow pint jars - place the clean empty jars in the basket under the bookshelf in the lobby. No jelly jars, please!

Recycle Beyond the Bag

Recycling plastic bags has become a habit for many of us. UCCG has been collecting bags at various times over the past few years. The bench in memory of Rev. Alan Miller is here, awaiting placement, and the Nursery School bench is on the way. Plastic bags are recyclable at many grocery stores (we use Giant and Wegmans for our drop off).

We have been asked about continuing the bag collection for a fourth bench. We've contacted the Nex Trex company, and we are eligible to start another collection. The rules have changed a bit. The time frame is 12 months to collect 1,000 pounds of plastic. The plastic needs to be weighed, photographed, delivered to Giant or Wegmans and recorded monthly in the Nex Trex portal.

We do have a few people who volunteered to transport the plastic to Giant and Wegmans, but we are looking for someone to run the program. For more information on what is required, please contact Karen Griffith or Sheri Stephens. In the meantime, please continue recycling plastic. Our planet thanks you.

Got Anxiety? You are not alone!

Anxiety is intense worry or fear over everyday events. This can be fear of a specific threat or vague feelings inside like uneasiness or a feeling of being out of control or dying. Anxiety manifests in the body with physical sensations such as sweating, chest tightness, increased heart rate, restlessness, and shaking. Anxiety also takes place in the mind with excessive worrying, fear of embarrassment, and catastrophic thinking. Causes can include change/adjustment, negative life events, trauma, isolation, stress, physical or mental health problems, or social pressure.

Statistics show that nearly 20% of individuals have an anxiety disorder. According to the National Institute of Health one third of adults reported experiencing anxiety and depression symptoms in 2023. Half of that number is accounted for by young people ages 18-24. Anxiety can lead to feeling frozen, not speaking up, or feeling uneasy and detached. While some anxiety is natural and can help us to make decisions and to prepare, when anxiety becomes too overwhelming and interferes with everyday functioning, it's important to practice coping strategies. If anxiety persists, consider treatment, such as therapy or medication.

Thankfully, anxiety can be reduced by practicing ways to care for ourselves. Coping strategies need to address the body, behaviors and emotions. Lifestyle and wellness practices include minimizing caffeine, avoiding drugs and alcohol, getting enough sleep and good nutrition, being physically active/exercising, having supportive relationships in which one can ask for help, keeping organized and growing a sense of meaning and spirituality. Awareness of thoughts that drive and sustain anxiety and replacing these with believable, factual ideas, and practicing helpful, encouraging self-talk is an ongoing need. Practicing relaxation with deep breathing techniques, mindfulness, imagery, stretching, time in nature, connecting with others and with interests are all ways we can manage and reduce anxiety. There is hope!

Here are some facts about the June Solstice - plus a Solstice guiz for you!

This year's solstice on Thursday, June 20, 2024 happens at the same instant for all of us, everywhere on Earth; only our clocks are different. In the eastern United States, the solstice occurs at 4:51 am EDT. Sure, you may know that the summer solstice is the "longest" day of the year in the Northern Hemisphere.

Here are a few Summer Solstice Facts

- The word "solstice" comes from the Latin words *sol* "sun" and *sistere* "to stand still." On the summer solstice, the sun's path stops advancing northward each day and appears to "stand" still in the sky before going back the other way.
- You may also observe that the midday sun is highest up in the sky (or, lowest if you live in the Southern Hemisphere.) But did you know that the sun's highest point is getting lower and lower over time? That's because earth's tilt is slowly decreasing.
- It may be the "longest" day," but it's not Don Harris the latest sunset. Nor the earliest sunrise! The earliest sunrises happen before the summer solstice and the latest sunset after the summer solstice.

With all that being said, most people only care about one single solstice fact: "It's the start of summer!" (or winter, if you live south of the equator).
