Ant's Corner

Inside Edition, Part 6 *"A Groovy Dance in a Funky Robe"*



I used to love tuning-in to Philadelphia's Adult Contemporary Pop radio station, WMGK - Magic 103, when I was a young boy. While other kids my age were rocking out to AC/DC and KISS on WMMR, I found myself drawn to the soothing sounds of Barry Manilow and The Carpenters. I

remember one afternoon when my dad and I were listening to "MGK" while painting a bedroom together, and The Byrds' song "Turn, Turn, Turn" came on. My dad turned to me and said, "Guess what, Ant? King Solomon wrote that song."

This verse always reminds me of our small dining groups. I absolutely love our small dining groups! The fact that we enjoy each other's company so much that some of our former groups continue to meet regularly—what I like to call our "legacy dining groups"—speaks volumes about the strength of our church community. Quick side note to whomever will be scheduling my SDG in February: I have a legit hankerin' for good Italian food, please!!

As humans, it's only natural that we seek moments of joy as often and for as long as we can. But life also comes with its fair share of challenges. 
BACK TO SCHOOL SUPPLIES

NEIGHBORS IN NEED

This year, the Neighbors in Need theme/focus is "**Mental Health Justice For All**!" The General Synod of the United Church of Christ passed a resolution to become WISE (Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, and Engaged) for mental health. UCCG passed this resolution in January 2024.

A just world for all is a world where the

human rights and well-being of people with mental health challenges are respected, no matter who you are or where you are in life's mental health journey. As you may recall, one-third of the NIN offering supports the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds are used by Justice and Witness Ministries to provide grants to UCC churches and organizations as well as supporting a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects.

"Mental Health is a Universal Human Right," and we hope you will join us with your financial support. We will be collecting and blessing this special mission offering on Sunday, October 6, 2024 as part of our World Communion Sunday. LIFT - LADIES IN FAITH TOGETHER - CAMPFIRE FOR A CAUSE

LIFT consists of UCCG women interested in gathering for fellowship and mission oriented projects. Our largest mission project for this year is Turning Point. They will be the recipient of the 2024 Campfire for a Cause. Turning Point assists domestic abuse survivors and their children. To date, we have accumulated a large amount of requested items for their program. Since I make it a mission to seek clearance sales, the items purchased have a retail value of \$3,514.66 and a purchase price of \$727.91. Following is a brief list of the items purchased.


FISH Team Request

What is the Harvest Moon?

The Harvest Moon appears from September 16 to 18! The moon will appear full for about three days around this time, from Monday through Wednesday. Why does this phenomenon happen? Learn more – and shine on Harvest Moon!

When is the Harvest Moon?

This year, the brilliant Harvest Moon first appears in the evening of Monday, September 16 before reaching peak illumination at 10:34 pm EDT on September 17.

One thing that sets the Harvest Moon apart from other full moon names is that it is not associated with a specific month, as the others are. Instead, the Harvest Moon relates to the timing of the autumnal equinox (September 22 2024), with the full Moon that occurs nearest to the equinox being the one to take on the name "Harvest Moon." This means that the Harvest Moon can occur in either September or October, depending on how the lunar cycle lines up with the Gregorian calendar.

The Harvest Moon does typically occur in September, taking the place of the full Corn Moon. However, it occasionally lands in October insead, replacing the full Hunter's Moon.

Why Is It Called the Harvest Moon?

For several evenings, the moonrise comes soon after sunset. This results in an abundance of bright moonlight early in the evening, which was a traditional aid to farmers and crews harvesting their summer-grown crops. Hence it's called the "Harvest" Moon!

There are just a little over 12 complete moon cycles every year, on average (there being about 29.53 days in a synodic month). The Harvest Moon isn't like the other moons.

- Usually, throughout the year, the moon rises an average of about 50 minutes later each day.
- But for the few nights around the Harvest Moon, the moon seems to rise at nearly the same time: just 25-30 minutes later across the northern U.S., and only 10-20 minutes later farther north in Canada and Europe.

Additionally, the Harvest Moon rises at sunset and then will rise very near sunset for several nights in a row because the difference is at a yearly minimum. It may almost seem as if there are full moons multiple nights in a row!

Chinese Harvest Moon Traditions

As a final note, it is not just Western civilization that has given special importance to the Harvest Moon. For Chinese people everywhere, this full moon is the occasion for the Festival of the August Moon (the "August" is through a calendar discrepancy) or Mid-Autumn Festival (in some cultures, the equinoxes and solstices have been considered the middle of the seasons). This festival is celebrated with joyful games and the eating of "Mooncakes."
