
I have two grandchildren, I love animals and have volunteered at rescue groups over the years.

Financial Stewardship for 2025 - Be the MIRACLE

On November 24, at our congregational meeting, we passed a budget that reflects a \$3,000 deficit.

At Faith Club on January 29, our book discussion led us to speak about SCARCITY vs. ABUNDANCE.

How do you function in this world? Do you trust that God is with you and will somehow make things work out for you? For Greenawalds?? Or do you live in fear of your world falling in on you? How are we going to get through this situation??

One of the bible passages we read was from Ephesians:

Now, all glory to God, who is able, through his mighty power at within US, to accomplish infinitely more than we might ask or think. Eph 3:20

In all situations, we must remember this verse. God IS working THROUGH/WITH us to do what is needed. We are empowered by God. **WE are the miracle that is needed.**

If we live in fear of not having enough, we go into a mode that is all about self-preservation. Our souls shrink and turn inward. However, if we believe in Jesus and trust that, with God, there is always an abundance... Of love, of life, of service.

So, can you be the miracle?


