



FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR JANET



To my Beloved Greenawalds Community, Let me paint a picture for you:

I am sitting on my spot on the sectional couch in my "TV room" which is also known as "Anthony's Studio." My feet are raised on the recliner to support the computer on which I am typing. My calendar is open on the couch to my left, other papers, my backpack, the computer charger... and Buddy are lying to my right. I have one of my three cats on my lap; Rosie is supported also by left arm which is extended so that my fingers can *just* reach the keys. My right arm is resting gently on Rosie, also extended forward so I can type. And for the first time in a year, the room is filled with beautiful music.

Anthony is sitting 15 feet away from me at his console with a guitar in his hands! He is playing a jazzy version of "The Way You Look Tonight" with a backing track to accompany his sweet sounds. Ahh... and now the song is "Mona Lisa."

So many of you have reached out and contacted me to wish us well as Anthony makes his transition home. I want you to know that I am thinking of each of you now with gratitude. My heart is full! Anthony is finally back where he belongs - home after 11.5 months away from us in Montgomery County Correctional Facility.

As we enter the season of Lent, I am reminded of the wilderness experience of Jesus on which the timing of Lent is modeled. From Luke 4:1-2: *Jesus returned from the Jordan River* [after his baptism] *full of the Holy Spirit, and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness. There he was tempted for forty days by the devil. He ate nothing during those days and afterward Jesus was starving.*

What a "wilderness" experience we have been through these past 2.5 years! From the DUI in July of 2022 to the house fire July of 2023 to the 352 days Anthony was away from us in MCCF. But right now, I am filled with so much hope, for I see our resurrection story as well!

To have Easter, we must have Good Friday. To have a resurrection, there must be some kind of death. The caterpillar doesn't just *become* a butterfly; it must dissolve into a disgusting pile of goo first.

No matter what stage of caterpillar or butterfly you are in, let us all come "home" to Greenawalds for Lent. We will journey through all the "goo" together-learning, growing, and even changing, as we look forward with hope to Easter moments. Like this one I am having tonight. Or like the ones we will have all together on April 20 at the Sunrise Easter service or the Celebration Easter service! May we always be reminded that our time in the wilderness WILL end and when it does, we are all that much closer to God.

Ant's Corner "Ain't that a 'Hole' in the Head"



Last March, my outlook was bleak. Now, I'm incredibly grateful to be home. The truth is, I thought my March 2025 article would be lighthearted, avoiding any mention of my time in MCCF... "Chock full o'Fluff", if you will. But as the saying goes, "If you want to make God laugh, tell Him your plans." I have a true "War Story" to tell!

Remember *Cool Hand Luke* (1967)? A prison guard played by actor Clifton James lists infractions that land you in "the box." Modern jails have their own version... "The Hole"—a restricted cell block with no TV, clock, or commissary access. And yes, I ended up there! No coffee... shoot me NOW!

So, here's the "Cliff's Notes version: One night, a high-ranking officer woke me, asking if I'd seen drug trafficking in the chapel. The answer? Yes. But as prison wisdom warns, "Snitches end up in ditches." I feigned uncertainty, and he urged me to "keep an eye out."

Jails see a lot of drug trade, with inmates "cheeking" medication and selling it.

Chēk'ing: Colloquial term for concealing a medication in the mouth, i.e., between the teeth and the cheek, in order to avoid swallowing it.

The chapel, where multiple blocks mix, is prime for the drug trade. As "Assistant to the Chaplain", I was an ideal candidate for informant.

But, alas... despite the officers' attempt at secrecy, inmates noticed my absence. *Why is Anthony talking to the COs??* Soon after, five inmates were cuffed and escorted to The Hole for "medication diversion." The officers realized I was now at risk, as the optics would indicate that I informed on them.

So, for my own protection, they placed me in the DREADED Hole under the guise of suspicion of "medication diversion", just like the others. Hey, they're more than welcome to my *Amlodipine* for hypertension and *Atorvastatin* for high cholesterol. All kidding aside, I was grateful for my safety. Afterall, it was only a couple of weeks of discomfort.

What they didn't tell me was that The Hole came with a brutal side effect—complete isolation from the outside world. No calls. No messages. Nothing. And, did I mention... NO COFFEE?

Panic set in fast. My family and I spoke multiple times a day, and now—radio silence. I could already picture Janet assuming the worst, convinced I'd had a heart attack or worse. And then, to add fuel to the fire, the chaplain informed her I had been placed in segregation for a misconduct involving drug trade in the chapel. Afterall, that's what the report read.

Yep. That was the official story—crafted in the name of protecting me. Imagine Janet's reaction. She was freaking out for days, until my letter finally arrived, explaining everything.

Here's the thing—I never would have voluntarily cut myself off from electronics and the outside world. In real life, I wouldn't have lasted five minutes without my phone. But The Hole forced me into a digital detox I didn't know I needed. And surprisingly, it changed me.

There were about twelve of us in that bleak, forgotten corner of the jail, and with nothing to distract us—no news, no social media, no endless scrolling—we talked. We shared our life stories, our regrets, our dreams. We leaned on each other. And somehow, in that miserable, windowless place, we found connection—a bond I have never experienced in my life.

One guy, Jason, who had this amazing talent for carving life-like sculptures out of bar soap, had always dreamed of learning music but never thought he'd get the chance. More accurately, he didn't believe he had the ability. So, with nothing but time, I gave him intense music theory lessons. He soaked it up like a sponge, and when it was finally time for me to leave, he handed me a letter that stopped me in my tracks. Here's a snippet:

In the world today, it is becoming very hard to find anyone to actually call a friend. People don't value friendship like they used to, but I value the friendship we have. I never thought I would ever tell another man that I would miss him when he's gone, but I will really miss you. Thank you for taking the time to actually teach me something I have always wanted to learn.

Friends, if I gained nothing else from those eleven-and-a-half months, that experience alone was invaluable.

I know most of you aren't glued to your electronics like *Millennials* and *Gen Z'ers*, but I challenge our younger folks to consider finding opportunities to separate from electronics, even if it's for an hour a day. The world will still be there when you return, but the people around you... they need you now. Life is incredibly precious, and we won't have the people we love forever. Love them hard, now.

So, put that phone down for a set time every day! We don't need electronics at the dinner table any more than we need a "Hole" in the head. Trust me; I know first hand!

Facts About the Penny

The penny was one of the first coins made by the U.S. Mint after its establishment in 1792. The design on the first penny was of a woman with flowing hair symbolizing liberty. The coin was larger and made of pure copper, while today's smaller coin is made of copper and zinc. The penny was the first U.S. coin to include the motto "In God We Trust".

In 1909, Teddy Roosevelt introduced the Lincoln cent to commemorate the 100-year anniversary of the 16th U.S. president's birth. At the time, it was the first American coin to feature the likeness of an actual person. In 1959, the Mint celebrated the 150th anniversary of Lincoln's birth by changing the reverse of the penny to the Lincoln Memorial. In 2009, the Mint issued four different designs to commemorate the 200th anniversary of Lincoln's birthday and the 100th anniversary of his appearance on the penny.

Approximately 30 million pennies are produced each day (The U.S. Mint produces more than 13 billion pennies each year), and more than two-thirds of all coins produced by the Mint are pennies.
